Nottawa Community School Request Option and Criteria for 23g Eligibility

Request for Assistance:

Eligibility of students for 23g extended school year and extended learning services will be determined using a multi-criteria approach.

Classroom teachers will do initial assessments to determine eligibility, then meet with Title I Teacher to determine services.

Criteria for selection of students includes <u>2</u> or more of the following:

| WIDA (for EL students only) Not proficient according to WIDA standards | WIDA (for EL students only) Not proficient according to WIDA standards |

^{*}Teacher recommendation is also considered in grades K-2. Classroom teacher to meet with Title I teacher to discuss what programs meet individual student needs.

Available Supports:

Extended School Year, aka, summer school and summer literacy programming. Small classes, groups or individual help: Title I Teacher, Teachers, and Parapos; will work with Tier 3 and Tier 2 students.

Extended Learning Time, aka, school year tutoring. Small groups or individuals help with the goal of closing instructional gaps and bring students up to grade level on CCSS (Common Core State Standards) for the identified subject area(s).
